The leisure center is well-equipped for sports enthusiasts, featuring the adventure pool »Die Welle«, an outdoor pool with mini-golf, giant slides and an ice sports arena. For relaxation and rejuvenation, the sauna world includes a steam bath, event sauna and a summer sunbathing lawn.

is the 764-meter-high adventure mountain Hoherodskopf. It offers year-round fun and excitement for the whole family, with attractions like the summer toboggan run, a climbing forest, a treetop path, ski slopes, cross-country trails and much more.



Unique nature experiences

await in Europe's largest extinct volcanic area, where striking basalt and volcanic rock formations have created impressive geological sites.









- **1 The town church** | This magnificent Rococo-style Protestant church boasts over 1,000 seats, a stunning stucco-marble pulpit wall, double galleries, a Wegmann organ, and the epitaphs of the noble Riedesel family from the 16th century.
- **2 Hohhaus palace and museum** | Step back in time as you explore this three-winged Baroque palace. Today, it houses the Hohhaus Museum, offering a glimpse of historical life with original furnishings. The grand hall is a perfect venue for events and weddings.
- **3 Anchor tower** | A quaint, covered watchtower set between the historic moat, the marketplace, and the banks of the Lauter River. Close by is the cozy Anker Tavern, perfect for a relaxing stop.
- **4 Castle** | Built for defense and now privately owned by the Riedesel family, this castle remains a symbol of the town's rich history and heritage.

Sights of Lauterbach

See. Discover. Fall in Love.

Surrounded by gently rising, forested hills, Lauterbach, the former capital and residence city, lies deep in the green Vogelsberg region. The towering spire of the town church, visible from afar, rises above the charming old town and marks the heart of this district town, through which the river Lauter flows. Narrow lanes lined with tightly packed half-timbered houses and beautifully crafted doorways lead to idyllic spots of historical significance. In Lauterbach, peaceful retreats offer picturesque panoramic views, and every stroll invites you to dream.

Don't forget: The stepping stones, which have been used as a bridge replacement then as well as now, should be crossed by everyone here at least once.




















- **5 Tourist-Center Stadtmühle** Once the town's brick mill, today it serves as a hub for tourist information and a fantastic starting and meeting point for explorations and city tours.
- **6 Stepping stones and »Strolch« monument** | Both are located in the river Lauter. You can cross the river dry-footed via 12 stone blocks and find yourself in a place dedicated to love.
- **7 Am Graben** | This district, once home to tanners, features a charming ensemble of half-timbered houses and merchant homes. Named after a former stream that powered five mills, this area is filled with small artisan houses, once inhabited by linen weavers and adorned with intricate designs. The most striking building is the Venetian warehouse built in 1823 by linen merchant Diehm.

The Vogelsberg cuisine is a true feast for connoisseurs. Master chefs create refined yet straightforward dishes from simple recipes and regional ingredients. The hearty classics are diverse and impress with their quality and local authenticity.

A true delight are the typical Lauterbach specialties, such as potato sausage, Beutelches, or Salzekuchen – mouth watering. Upon request, these can also be served in vegetarian or vegan variations.

Lauterbach is the gateway to a wild and romantic natural paradise, the Hoher Vogelsberg Nature Park. A former railway line with fine asphalt and moderate inclines promises cycling fun over 94 kilometers through pristine landscapes.

Premium hiking trails, such as the Wiesen or Bachtour, invite you to embark on a nature expedition through geotopes featuring ancient basalt formations, past almost hidden waterways, and along historic paths lined with gnarled pollard trees.

Unforgettable panoramic views and the beautiful surroundings of Lauterbach make it a haven for nature lovers.

Vibrant Lauterbach

A visit to Lauterbach is worth any time, as a variety of events and cultural highlights are offered throughout the year. The Lauterbach merchant, artisan, and customs markets stand for quality and diversity rarely found elsewhere. The weekly and regional markets provide opportunities for sustainable shopping in the old town.

The Lauterbach Pentecost Music Days are renowned across the county for showcasing the talents of well-known artists through various concerts. A traditional highlight is the Lauterbach Premium Market, featuring a nine-day diverse program with performances by popular music groups from the region.









Originally a livestock show, this market has long established itself as the largest folk festival in the area. The judging and awarding of animals and the merchant market remain integral parts of the celebration. An exciting amusement park rounds off the offerings.

In late summer, the City festival (Stadtfest) or River Lauter Festival (Lauterfest) provides a weekend full of musical and culinary highlights for the whole family, combined with shopping experiences on Sunday.

The Hohhaus Garden transforms into a romantic Christmas market on two weekends in December, one of the oldest in the region.

Historical LauterbachBreathe. Unwind. Regenerate.

As the former residence of the Riedesel barons of Eisenbach, Lauterbach reflects the historical splendor of Hessian nobility. The old town showcases impressive merchant houses in the typical half-timbered style of the region. Everywhere, the original rural life intertwines with noble charm: today, the Stadtpalais Hohhaus houses a museum that offers insights into the history of the estate and its diverse collections.

Exceptional personalities have also shaped the city's history. Their biographies span from the weaving mills along the Lauter to the bays of the Caribbean, from the pottery workshops beside moat to the heart of Brussels, and from the festive halls of the castle to the rotunda of the Capitol in Washington, D.C.



Friederike Riedesel zu Eisenbach | Two Riedesels crossed the Atlantic and spread the Christmas tree tradition in North America.

Johann Friedrich Diehm | Lauterbach linen sailed around half the world in the 18th century, from the North Sea to Cuba.

Adolf Spieß | In the wake of »Turnvater Jahn«, this Lauterbach native became a pioneer of German gymnastics.

Albert Fink | A Lauterbach resident revolutionized American railway construction.



Good accessibility is ensured with public transportation options such as the Vogelsberg Railway, bus connections through VGO/RMV, or the city bus.

By Car:

- A5 from Kassel or Frankfurt Exit Alsfeld East, then take B254 to Lauterbach (17 km)
- A7 from Kassel or Würzburg Exit Fulda South, then take B254 to Lauterbach (35 km)

B275 from Friedberg to Lauterbach

By Train:

You can reach *Lauterbach (Hess) Nord* station via the ICE station in Fulda with the Vogelsberg Railway HLB RB45, route Fulda – Gießen.
